FLEAT IV

The 4th International Conference on Foreign Language Education and Technology (FLEAT IV) is a joint conference sponsored by LLA (Language Laboratory Association of Japan) and the IALL (International Association for Learning Laboratories, USA). The conference will be held at Kobe University of Commerce and at Central Facilities of Kobe Academic and Research Town in Japan from July 29th to August 1st in the year 2000. The main theme of FLEAT IV is 'Language Learning and Multimedia: Bridging Humanity and Technology'. The conference, although focusing on issues inherent in the above theme, will provide an international forum not limited only to comprehensive discussions of technology in language learning and teaching, but also covering cognitive processes of language skills, cross-cultural aspects of language learning, first and/or second language acquisition, and related areas. As this conference is the first FLEAT Conference to be held in western Japan, which has close relations with other Asian countries, contributors from those areas will be especially welcomed.

FLEAT IV is currently inviting proposals for papers to be presented in oral and poster sessions. Papers should be

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presented in either English or Japanese. Presentation time is 30 minutes including 10 minutes of discussion for an oral session and 2 hours for a poster session. Those who wish to present should send one (1) abstract in English (not in Japanese) of about 500 words in length to the following eemail address: fleatsnb@kobeuc.ac.jp. In addition to the abstract, include the following infomation in the email:

- i) Language to be used in the presentation: English or Japanese
- j) Preferred session: Oral or Poster
- k) Title of the presentation
